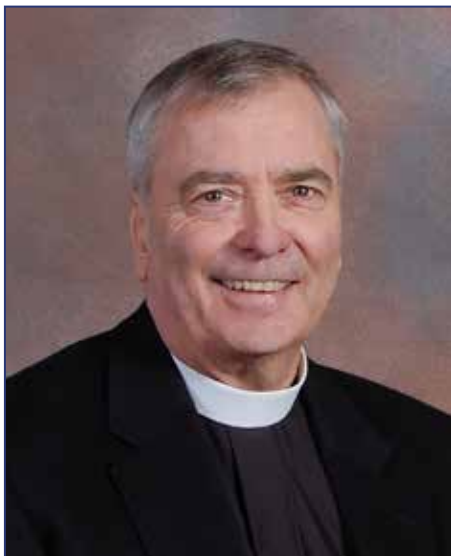

## A Story From Linda Daly

My daughter is a director at Cigna. At the end of every Friday, she writes and sends out something thankful and inspirational to her team. The inspiration below is from this past Friday and I wanted to share it with all of you.

### Lessons of war

I was very close to my grandfather, my Pa. He taught me to ride a bike, tie my shoes, and ice skate. He was a gentleman. Handsome and honorable, he always smelled like freshly pressed shirts and Old Spice. He was a decorated World War II veteran, flying 67 missions to bomb the Nazi oil fields in Romania and other industrial targets. He was a ball-turret gunner and hung in a glass bubble on the bottom of the plane. He was stationed in Southern Italy and shared a tent with his five fellow airmen, his crew. His war stories fascinated me. I remember his vivid description of the early morning sky... an endless expanse of clouds and

blue broken apart suddenly and violently by the descent of the Luftwaffe. But there was one story he didn't tell me as a child, one he would tell me years later. It was the story of the day he did not go up. On that day, there was confusion; his crew went up without him. They never returned. That night, he was alone in the tent with five empty cots. It was too much. The Army sent him to a convent in Sicily for "R&R". He returned two weeks later, joined another crew and continued to bomb the oil fields. He earned two Presidential Citations, three Battle Stars & the Air Medal with four Oak Leaf Clusters. When he came home, he started a family and became a police officer, spending most of his 30 years with the department as Detective Lieutenant in charge of the Juvenile Bureau where his focus was always helping errant kids straighten their lives out. Before he passed away, he gave me the wooden Rosary beads the nuns had given him at the convent more than 75 years ago. The other night, I held the Rosary for a while and thought about Pa, his sacrifices, and the suffering and sacrifices of so many during the War. Now, as we face a different enemy, when so much is uncertain, and the biggest battles still lie ahead, I took strength from his memory and his story. I hope you do, too.
