


A Message from Your Priest in Charge

The journey to Bethlehem presented us with something that may be viewed as a kind of paradox. We celebrated an event in the past by living into the future.

Most of us purchased presents for our loved ones in preparation for Christmas. Buying Christmas gifts was all about the future I'm living into (Christmas Day.) The excitement, anticipation and joy when buying the present was about an event in the future. And it's the most exciting time of the year!

You and I tend to define ourselves by our past, for the most part on failures and inadequacies with the inevitable guilt and shame. We drag the past into the present and live as the Prayer Book says "heavy laden."

The exercise during Easter was to invent our future by using two words that express my soul when I'm at my best. For me it is to be loving and generous. This is to reinvent ourselves as a new creation based in the future, living into, not the past I'm coming from.

Consider how exciting it is when you've planned a vacation. The future I'm living into (vacation) creates the joy and excitement right now!

Reinvent yourself using two words that are an expression of you at your best. It creates a future to live into.

I can either be the lifeless guilt of my past or I can be eager to live into the future I've created for myself.

As the good book says, I can choose what brings life to me or I can choose what destroys my well-being. As we begin the new year, there's not a better time to choose life!

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Saturday, December 21, 2019. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The actions of the Little Lamb, Shepherd's Haven and Thrift Shoppe Management Groups were ratified. The report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit.

--The Income & Expense Report for the period ending November 30, 2019 was distributed.

-The Nominating Committee, consisting of Karen Cahill, Louise Hanania, Karen Bogert and Matt Hanania, reported that the nominees for Vestry are Sue Helm, Lewis Marshall, Alison Thornhill, Zigi Zacs and Sue Cook. -A motion was passed to keep our annual pledge to the Diocese the same as last year, at 11% of our Normal Operating Income.

-A motion was passed to hold the Christ Church Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 29, 2020 immediately following the 9:30 am worship service.

-A motion was passed, according to the regulations of the Diocese, that the appropriate portion of Fr Stephen's compensation package be designated as housing allowance.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 28, 2020.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish of Christ Church, Pompton Lakes, New Jersey, will be held following the 9:30 am worship service on Sunday, January 26, 2020, for the purpose of electing one Warden, three members of the Vestry for three-year terms, one member of the Vestry for a one-year term, and delegates to the Annual Convention of the Diocese of Newark; to hear reports, adopt the 2020 parish budget, and to consider any other business which properly may come before this meeting.

Karen Bogert, Karen Cahill, Louise Hanania and Matt Hanania are on the Nominating Committee. The Nominees are Sue Helm, Lewis Marshall, Alison Thornhill, Zigi Zacs and Sue Cook. If you would like to make a nomination, please see the instructions in the following excerpt from our By-Laws. "Article 2.9 Nominations by Petition. Any six (6) qualified voting members may nominate another qualified voting member for any office to be elected by providing a signed petition to the Clerk of the Vestry (Sue Helm) seven days prior to the Annual Meeting. If the Clerk receives such nominations, she shall present to the Priest in Charge, the name/s of the nominee/s. After verification of eligibility of the candidates, the chairperson shall immediately post a notice of nominee/s on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall and email it to every household in the parish. No nominations shall be made from the floor."
