


A Message from Your Priest in Charge



Dear Friends,

This comes from my sermon on the first Sunday of Lent. It is especially meant for those of you who weren't able to be in Church.

"My friends, watch out! Don't let evil thoughts or doubts make any of you turn from the living God." Hebrews 3:12-19

"Thoughts," in and of themselves, are not evil. You and I have a million of them every day. Most of them, I daresay, are judgmental. Thoughts are, however, the source of evil. They become the source of evil when I act on them.

I like to think of my thoughts as the voices that speak to me inside my head. They never go away. When I was eighteen years old, worshipping at the Episcopal Cathedral in Panama, I received a "calling" to be a priest. There was this voice that beckoned me into the priesthood. There was another voice, quite louder, that reminded me, "You can't be a

priest. You stole twenty dollars from your father that he asked you to put into the Church collection. People would laugh you right out of the Church if they knew who you really are!" The voice was troubling, to say the least. It haunted me for a long time with the reminder I'm no good or certainly not good enough.

It took me many years to discover that these two voices were distinct. One was the voice of God and the other the voice of the devil.

The discovery came when I learned to distinguish which voice was speaking to me. The voice of God beckoned me forward and left me with a sense of joy. The kingdom is always presented as something "at hand" or in front of us. "Thy kingdom come." The voice of the devil haunted me with the guilt of my past – something behind me. It affected my soul with a deep sense of resignation.

I use the voice of the devil now. Previously, it used me. I use it by responding, "Thank you for reminding me who I belong to, and it ain't you, sucker!"

Any voice that turns us from the living God is the voice of the devil. Actually, it's not my voice or I could stop it! Distinguish which voice is speaking to you. It will restore the kingdom within. It will promote "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done." Amen.

Mothering Sunday

hrist Church will be celebrating Mothering Sunday at both services on Sunday, March 31, 2019. Mothering Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, has been observed since medieval times. In that era, children were taken from their families by the age of seven and sent to work as indentured servants of the lords of the land. Once a year, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, these children were sent home to visit their mothers, and allowed to bake and take with them Simnel bread as a gift.

Over the years the Anglican Church has carried on this observance as the first Mother's Day Celebration. You are invited to join us as we celebrate this joyous occasion. If you would like to bake your own Simnel bread, the recipe follows. Please bring it to church on March 31 and place it on the "birthday bank" table to be blessed. Eat the cake yourself, or share it with your Mom or loved ones.

February Vestry Meeting Highlights

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Tuesday, February 26, 2019. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The actions of the Little Lamb, Shepherd's Haven, and Thrift Shoppe Management Groups were ratified. The report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit.

- The Income & Expense Report for the period ending January 31, 2019 was distributed.
- Renovations will begin in the Parish Hall on March 3. The ceiling grid will be painted and new ceiling tiles will be installed.

When that is complete, the walls will be repaired and painted and new draperies will be installed. Repairs need to be made in the Narthex. There are broken floor tiles and there is no footing under the front door. The Church should have better handicap access. Options are being discussed.

- There will be an adult book study for five Wednesday in Lent beginning on March 13.
- The Tricky Tray will be on March 29. Lots of help and donations are needed.
- There will be a blood drive on March 23 in the Parish Hall from 8 am until 1 pm.
- A motion was passed to order a new Memorial Garden wall plaque using funds from Undesignated Memorials.
- A motion was passed to approve the Diocesan Parochial Report.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 26, 2019.

Simnel Bread

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Have at room temperature 1 cup of butter and five eggs. Butter and flour one large loaf pan or two small ones. Cream until light and fluffy 1 cup butter (sweet is best) and 1 2/3 cups sugar; beat in, one at a time, five eggs.

When creamy, slowly add 2 cups flour. Fold in ½ cup of raisins or ½ cup of sultanas (white raisins) or ½ cup of currants or 1/4 cup of candied peel of citron. (Dredge fruit in 1/4 cup of flour.) Spoon mixture into buttered and floured loaf pan(s) and bake 45 minutes to an hour or until inserted toothpick comes out clean. Cool 15 minutes before removing from pan. Wrap in aluminum foil and then in plastic wrap. Do not eat for 24 hours. You may ice it if you wish with a butter cream icing or poured fondant.
