


A Message from Your Priest in Charge



Dear Friends,

For over a thousand years, All Saints Day, November 1, has been celebrated within the Christian Church. These are people, known and unknown, who have made a difference in our world being guided by the Spirit of God – the Holy Spirit.

This begs the question, "Are you guided by the Spirit of God?" We're either owned by the world (get as much as you can) or we're owned by the Spirit of God (give as much as you can.) Jesus once remarked "you find meaning in your life by giving it away."

Are you one of God's Saints? "No, not me" is the usual response. "If you knew me, really knew me, you would know that my past is filled with huge infractions. No, not me, I would be ashamed and embarrassed to confess my track record."

Have you ever read The Confessions of St. Augustine? One of the premier Saints in the Church has a track record, too! He is considered a saint, not

because of the absence of nasty, but because of the focus on making a difference in God's world, contributing to the wellbeing of the other.

Saying "No, I'm not" in response to the question "are you one of God's Saints," is a clever way of not being responsible (able to respond) for the presence of God's Spirit in the world. "No" is focused on our past. "Yes" maintains the premise given at our baptism and confirmation to respect the dignity of every human being. You are one of God's Saints when you say so. Yes, we are owned by God, have relapses, and are still owned by God nonetheless.

Keep your focus in front of you! It allows for God's Spirit to show up in the world and it keeps me from focusing on "nasty" and "awful."

No one who puts his head to the plow and looks back, is fit for the kingdom, Jesus reminds us.

So, are you one of God's Saints? If you say so. Amen.

October Vestry Meeting Highlights

The regular monthly meeting of the Priest in charge, Wardens and Vestry was held on Tuesday, October 17, 2017. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The actions of the Thrift Shoppe, Shepherd's Haven, and Little Lamb Management Groups were ratified. The report of the Treasurer was accepted subject to audit.

- The Income & Expense Report for the period ending September 30, 2017 was distributed.
- There will be a Paint & Sip Party on Wednesday, November 15 at 7pm. This is not a fundraiser, just for fun and fellowship. Sign up in the Parish Hall..
- Father Stephen met the refugee family. He was welcomed into their home. It was a very good meeting. The parents have five children and live in a horrible neighborhood. Fr. Stephen will get specific information about their needs and ways we can help them..
- A motion was passed to hire landscapers to work on the grounds around the Church and the property at 420 Ramapo Avenue. They will spend two weeks pulling out weeds and trimming back bushes. They also will remove bushes and add new plantings. Costs will not be more than \$14,551. An additional landscaper will be hired to maintain the grounds (not including the lawn) from May to October at a cost of \$1,100 per month.
- A motion was passed to purchase an additional wall plaque for the Memorial Garden to hold the name plates. The total cost, delivered and installed is \$11,596.00.

The minutes of the Vestry meeting will be posted on the bulletin board in the Parish Hall as they become available. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 21, 2017.

Who Is My Neighbor?

Then the disciples asked Jesus to define "neighbor", He replied with the parable about the Good Samaritan. What He said then is just as relevant to us now. While Christ's lesson was appropriate for the society in which He and His disciples lived, mainly Judea and its hostility towards Samaria, the message does not change. Who is our neighbor? Is it the person next door or is it someone who may not live close by but needs us to share the Kingdom of Heaven with him (her)? When the Good Samaritan saw that person in need, he did not hesitate; he just did what God's love streaming through his heart and soul inspired him to do. Participation with the Neighborhood Initiative has taught me that a neighbor is anyone in need, whether that person is a member of Christ Church or not, whether that person is next door or miles away and will never meet those responsible for sharing God's gifts. Helping those in need has been an ongoing activity with the members of Christ Church and we have done it often and well in different and creative ways. The Neighborhood Initiative links Church members in the many "neighborhoods" that comprise Christ Church. It also goes beyond the geography of our Church Members to others who are in need. The backpack project - where refugees living in Passaic County received much needed school supplies - expressed the love and caring that Christ Church has for a group of people who, somehow, have fallen through the cracks. Adopting a Syrian family will do the same and I whole heartedly welcome this as we - the Christian Community of Christ Church - continue to walk in the footsteps of – the Good Samaritan.

Welcome to the Senior Corner

Hi, it's Joyce McDiarmid and my plan is to pass on information to our senior members and their caregivers regarding programs that you might not be aware of that could help in your everyday life.

The 2015 NJ Homestead Rebate filing deadline is November 30, 2017. You may be eligible if:

- You were a New Jersey resident; and
- You owned and occupied a home in New Jersey that was your principal residence on October 1, 2015; and
- Property Taxes for 2015 were paid on that home;

Also

- Your 2015 New Jersey Gross Income cannot be more than \$150,000 for homeowners 65 or older or blind or disabled on December 31, 2015; or
- \$75,000 for homeowners under 65 and not blind or disabled on December 31, 2015.

People who qualified in the past received a rebate average of \$500.

If you don't have an application call 1-888-238-1233. Be patient, that number is often busy.



Thanksgiving 2017

Thanksgiving is fast ap-**I** proaching. Christ Church will celebrate this holiday on the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day (November 19). Again we will decorate the Altar with real fruit, vegetables, breads and cakes which makes this a unique celebration. The decorating will be done on the Saturday before Thanksgiving, November 18. This year, the Altar Guild is asking for small monetary donations to purchase the food items instead of asking for various items we may be left with that could go to waste. The fresh fruits and vegetables we purchase will be distributed to those in need. Cakes will be brought to the shut-ins that are visited. Please place any monetary donations in the box marked for the Altar Guild on the Vestry Room table any Sunday between now and November 12. In addition, we ask that each person bring in non-perishable food items, stews, hash, soups and canned vegetables, cereal, pasta, etc., to either the 8:00 am or 9:30 am service on November 12. Baskets will be placed near the Baptismal font. This food will be delivered to needy families. Thank you for your generosity.



Life Line Screening Comes to Christ Church

Breakfast With Santa!



Book of Remembrance

You may have noticed the red book on the Prayer Desk on November 2, and when the Lay Reader read the Prayers of the People, names you haven't heard in a while were read along with the names of those in whose memory altar flowers were given, or who were recently deceased.
