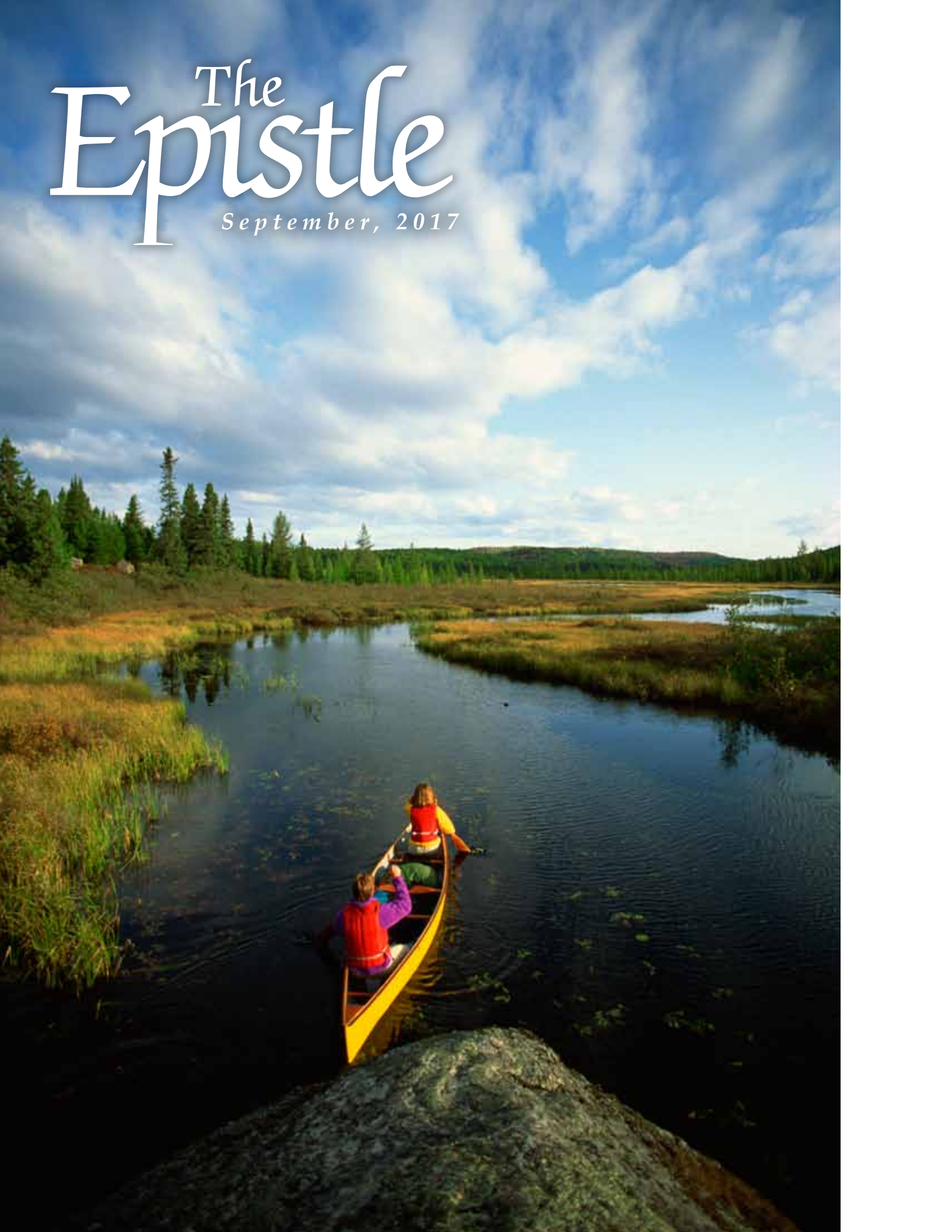
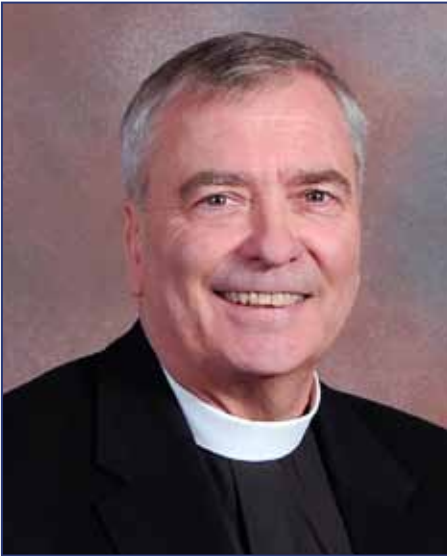

## A Message from Your Priest in Charge



Dear Friends,

We begin again. September is like the beginning of the New Year for Church. The choir begins again, and the Sunday School. Attendance is back to its usual capacity – which is wonderful. Your generosity shows up especially at the 8 am service when 45 in attendance is not unusual. Wednesday morning's attendance has been increasing as well, sometimes as much as 18!

Every year Christ Church adopts a theme to live into and support. Last year we focused on Special Olympics and Huntington's Disease. Before that was Cystic Fibrosis, Food for the Poor in Haiti, and building water wells in the Dominican Republic.

I would like to propose this theme to focus on in the coming months. It comes from our Baptismal Covenant in the Book of Common Prayer, page 417, something we all have in common!

"Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?"

This may be enacted, for some of us, by addressing issues of injustice, prejudice, bigotry etc. on the national level, through our Congress men and women – those who represent us on a national level.

And there are many opportunities within our local communities where our Baptismal Covenant may be applied. We have long had racial prejudice in Passaic County, especially directed at many in the Ringwood Community. We are adopting a Syrian family to take care of their needs. We emphasize dignity in our Church. Have you acknowledged anyone yet with "Celebrating God's Presents" the last Sunday of every month? There was a hunger drive in Ringwood this past June. The first one ever! Thanks to Ellen Ewing, Sue Helm and others.

This is the business of the church: "Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?"

This is the responsibility of the Church and the responsibility of everyone living into the Baptismal Covenant. Take it on nationally. Take it on locally. The whole purpose of the Church, any Church, is to contribute to the well-being of others.

You listened to Denise Zukow and Jason's mother, Colleen, about how HD has affected their families. The outpouring of love and support has been overwhelming for all of us in the Giannone and Walsh families helping us raise approximately \$9,700.00.

It was quite emotional for all of us to have Jason attend as our guest of honor. Even though he can't speak, walk, talk, eat solid food, or get from one place to another on his own we saw he was excited to be surrounded by his family and caring people that came in support of this evening of music and fundraising. The funds raised from this event is to support research and to assist families who need help with caring for their family members with HD.

Although this event was in honor of Jason, he will not benefit from it. Jason will not see a cure. He will not receive anything from the proceeds of this event. What he has received

from each of you is being recognized as a significant voice for fighting towards a cure for others. This past week while we were preparing for this event, his mother was making arrangements as requested by Jason to donate his brain to Columbia Presbyterian for research just as his brother did several years ago. Jason wants to do whatever he can to help those with HD have a chance to be a cured.

Whether you offered to donate a basket, a bottle of wine, made a donation or came to the event, Jason and the HD community were received with respect and dignity by your listening and acknowledging the impact Huntington's Disease has. Our families sincerely thank you for this precious gift.

## Life Line Screening Comes to Christ Church

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings will be here at Christ Church on Wednesday, November 22, 2017.
